Annual Meeting Notice and Call for Papers

The Tenth Annual Meeting of the Society will be held on Saturday, March 28, 1964 at Michigan State University, East Lansing, in conjunction with the meetings of the Michigan Academy of Science, Arts and Letters. Dr. S. K. Gangwere (Wayne State University), President of the Society will preside. Details will be sent in next newsletter.

This newsletter is primarily a call for papers for the meeting. If you wish to present a paper please fill in the form below. In order for the titles of papers to be included in the printed program of the Academy they must be in our hands no later than the 1st of January. Members of the Academy who present papers in our meeting are eligible to have these published in the "Papers of the Michigan Academy of Science, Arts and Letters. Part 1. Natural Science". Please also indicate whether you plan to attend the luncheon (informal) so that we may arrange for a room of the appropriate size.

The Society again offers four cash prizes for the best papers presented in the Annual Meeting. There will be first (\$25) and second (\$15) prizes in each of two categories: Undergraduate-Amateur, and Graduate Student-Advanced Amateur (but only those who have published less than 10 papers in entomology.)

All Society members who are not members of the Michigan Academy are urged to join that organization. In addition to eligibility for publication, members of the Academy receive the journal and may participate in the activities of that organization. Our continuing affiliation with the Academy, which attracts entomologist members of the Academy to our Annual Meeting, is partially dependent on having a reasonable proportion of our members also members of the Academy.

### Report on the Ninth Annual Meeting and Award Winners

The 1962 Annual Meeting of the Society was held on March 23rd at Western Michigan University, Kalamazoo. Despite the distance from the headquarters of the three Branches, there was a good turn-out, about 20 to 30 persons. A full program of 12 papers, organized by Roland Fischer, was presented, and there was time for a discussion of each paper. The Best Paper Awards this year went to the following participants:

- Walter Moberly (University of Michigan), First Prize, Graduate Student Category, for "Respiration Rates in Polistes".
- Gottfried Hogn (then from University of Kansas, now at University of Michigan), Second Prize, Graduate Student Category, for "Behavior and Ecology of the Fern Sawfly, Aneugmenus flavipes (Hymenoptera, Tenthredinidae)".
- Richard J. Snider (Michigan State University), Undergraduate Category, for "A New Record for Lepidocyrtus paradoxus Uzel in North America (Entomobryidae: Collembola)".

The congratulations of the Society to the award winners, and the thanks of the Society to all participants. A brief business meeting followed the paper session. The financial report of the Executive Secretary, showing a balance of \$374.68 before the payment of the 1963 awards, was accepted. This amount was almost \$25 less than the balance at the 1962 Annual Meeting, indicating that dues receipts are not covering the cost of the award program. Mogens Nielson (Lansing) was unanimously elected President-Elect of the Society. Theodore J. Cohn (University of Michigan) was re-elected Executive Secretary.
